PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS

Enrichment credits are earned for classes taken outside the regular school schedule. A minimum of 25 hours of class or study time is needed for each (0.25) credit. Students can earn a max of (0.25) credit for one sport per season. Students must earn the below number of enrichment credits to be promoted and graduate:

SIGN-UP PROCEDURE

- (1) Student acquires a signed form from enrichment teacher or coach.
- (2) student fills out all information (including ID #) on form and has advisor sign form.
- (3) **student submits form AND \$25 enrichment fee to front office by Friday, September 9th. No forms or payments will be accepted after this date. NO EXCEPTIONS. NOTE: Sports payments are more.**
- (4) front office accepts payment, issues receipt, stamps form “paid,” and submits form to Dean of Students office.

Enrichments start the week of September 12th, 2016.
